Puglia Sounds Musicarium, the School of Music Professions, is back with another amazing series of events! The series will commence on June 20 and conclude on June 23. It will be held at various venues, including the Conservatorio Statale di Musica "Giovanni Paisiello," Teatro Fusco, and the University. This year's series will feature a selection of exceptional courses, some of which will be delivered in the field.

The annual event, **Medimex Music Factory**, will be held at the Conservatorio Statale di Musica "Giovanni Paisiello" from June 20 to 22. This year, the event is being organized in collaboration with **Sony Music Publishing Italy** and will include two categories: **soundtracks for film and TV series**, and **singer-songwriting**. The contest accepts submissions from 10 composers (aged 35 and under) and 18 singer-songwriters (aged 30 and under). Sony will select two trainees from among the participants to receive two prizes. A working day (in Rome, expenses paid by Sony) with one of the tutors will be awarded to the winners of the **soundtrack category**. The winners of the **singer-songwriting category** will be awarded the production, digital release and promotion of a single with a record label.
